

Your Voting Rights

- **Any qualified US citizen** is entitled to vote without regard to disability, race or color with no literacy tests employed.
- **Voters**, while in the process of registering or voting, shall not be intimidated, threatened or coerced by any person.
- **A person** in a jurisdiction may cast a provisional ballot if the person's name does not appear on the official list of registered voters of that precinct.
- **Voters** voting a provisional ballot shall be provided written information on how to find out whether or not the vote was counted. If the vote was not counted or partially counted, voters are entitled to know the reason.
- **Voters** needing assistance may receive as much assistance as is requested by the voter.
- **Qualified citizens** shall be permitted to register up to the 25th day before the election.
- **Voters** who have moved within their assigned precinct or changed their name without notifying the appropriate Board of Elections shall be allowed to update that information prior to voting and vote following procedures adopted by the county board of elections.
- **Voters**, whose right to vote has been challenged and sustained, are eligible to vote a challenged ballot.
- **Voters** will be voting in an accessible polling place.
